


We need your help to keep the islands pet and pest-free!

It's really important that we keep the Bay of Islands wildlife sanctuary safe from pets and pests so the rare wildlife that lives on the islands can flourish. You can help by doing some biosecurity checks before you leave the mainland.

There are 10 differences in the pictures below, can you spot them all? Which ones are biosecurity risks? Hint: some of the differences can be found on the biosecurity check list below.
